
Our May 22 kickoff meeting was a delight! To see so many reunions was gratifying. Our August barbeque picnic should be an outstanding event, so please plan to be there.

Greetings, retirees and associates! This column hopes to have information which will be useful to the senior citizens among us. Since one of the intentions of Mars Associates is to help one another, any information you may have to share is most welcome. Please feel free to contribute.

Did you know ___

That if you have attained the age of 62, you are eligible to receive a free pass to the National Parks? It's called the "Golden Age Passport" and is a lifetime admission permit. You, and the occupants of your car, may enter any designated fee areas of the National Park System administered by the National Park Service. You are also entitled to use any designated recreation site, facilities, equipment, or services provided at the rate of 50 percent of the established use fees. This does not include private concessions in any of the parks.

In addition to the National Parks, the pass is also honored at facilities administered by the Bureau of Land Management, Fish and Wildlife Service, Bureau of Reclamation, Army Corps of Engineers, Forest Service, and the Tennessee Valley Authority if you happen to be down that way.

Don't pass up this bargain! How much cheaper can it be than free? Pick up your pass (with proof of age, of course) at 655 Parfet Street in Lakewood, Colorado. Parfet is ten blocks west of Kipling. This pass is reportedly available at all National Park System areas where entrance fees are charged. For more information, call locally at 236-4648.
