PRESIDENT'S REPORT Ken Marts

On March 21, 1985, the Martin Aerospace Retirement Society (MARS) Associates was established to provide social, educational, recreational and self-improvement opportunities for retirees and significant others of Martin Marietta Aerospace in Denver, Colorado. Now, in January of 2025, we are completing the fortieth year of our organization. This last year, we continued offering a variety of special activities, in addition to our five standard major events, with great participation from our members. This effort began in 2022 under the leadership of Bill Wise (Marketing) and continued into 2024 under the leadership of Dick Sosnay. In 2025 we will continue to build on our events and activities that have helped make this organization such a success, as well as continue searching for new activities to make MARS even stronger. We also continue to add members from new ULA and LM retirees, working with the management of each organization, to advertise the benefits of MARS Associates membership.

This report provides a written summary of the activities of your MARS Officers, Board of Directors, Volunteers and MARS Clubs during the year 2024. This same information will be presented in a short briefing at our Annual Meeting on March 19, 2025. A high-level ULA executive will present the current ULA plan at our 2025 Annual Meeting. In keeping with the spirit of our efforts to reduce our environmental footprint and lower costs, you will find the latest MARS Annual Report and the latest versions of the Bylaws and Policy Manual on the MARS Website [ABOUT > POLICY DOCUMENTS], as usual. In this report, we highlight our activities and accomplishments for 2024, recognize the contributions of our current officers and directors, identify changes in the leadership for 2025, and preview the way forward for the coming year.

Activities Summary: Linda Duby once again did an outstanding job planning and arranging our major events for 2024. She invested many hours to make these events successful and enjoyable for all. Carl Kaminski provided critical support in providing name tags at the welcome desk. Linda Stearns once again coordinated the MARS Day at the Rockies. Lisa Cox will be stepping in and taking over from Linda Stearns in 2025.

MARS Associates sponsors five major events for membership each year. These events are listed below. Additional details are in the VP Activities Report.

Annual Meeting at Lockheed Martin's Deer Creek facility (March 20, 2024) Summer Luncheon recognizing Seniors at Ken Caryl Manor House (June 26, 2024) MARS Day at the Rockies – Picnic and Game (June 5, 2024) Annual Picnic at Clement Park (September 11, 2024) Holiday Celebration at Wellshire Events Center (December 4, 2024)

In 2024, continuing our effort to recruit new retirees and broaden participation within our current membership, we held several Happy Hour Events:

Happy Hour 1 at Blue Spruce Brewing Company in Ken Caryl (February 21, 2024) Happy Hour 2 at Platte River Bar & Grille (July 23, 2024)

At those events, MARS Associates provided appetizers, and we had many *happy* attendees including MARS members and prospective members. Feedback from the participants was extremely positive and we are now planning to continue with more Happy Hours in 2025.

Treasury Summary: Charlie Haupt continued in his duties as Treasurer and did an excellent job ensuring that we gathered, maintained, and shepherded our funds. The Treasurer maintains the MARS budget and monthly income and expense activity. Our balance on January 1, 2024, was \$16,278.08 and ending balance was \$19,546.82 on December 31, 2024. Our 2025 budget has a projected income of \$42,821 and expenses of \$49,925. Additional details are provided in the Treasurer's Report later.

2024 saw an increase in membership dues collected from an audit performed assessing people in either Delta Dental or VSP insurance coverage whose dues had lapsed. Approximately 60% of the people remitted the past dues to remain members of MARS Associates. The remaining people have elected not to renew their membership. Your MARS Associates leadership team strongly suggests you consider the digital access to the MARS STAR on our website at www.marsretirees.org. We also strongly encourage you to sign up for mass e-mailers to be sent to you from the MARS Associates website to stay abreast of the latest happenings in our dynamic organization. Instructions for doing this are on our website.

One of the most labor-intensive tasks of the Treasurer position is receiving (via US Mail) and processing checks from members for dues and event costs. Last year, we continued with the implementation of online membership renewal and dues payment capability using STRIPE. That effort was successful in streamlining and simplifying the Treasurer's job. We also continued this process for our annual events. We will continue with these efforts in 2025 with the introduction of STRIPE invoicing as a reminder to pay yearly dues.

Communications Summary: Dan Ellerhorst continued as the VP of Communications to herald in the recently new website. Steve Sande is now filling the role of prime website contact, with Rick Gonzales as his backup. Mike Carroll continues his role in distribution of the MARS STAR. We also introduced a new mass-mailing system from ZOHO campaigns which improves the efficiencies of mass-mailing and allows metrics to provide data on email success and problems. Steve also serves as the MARS Associates Facebook coordinator, keeping our Facebook friends apprised of the latest happenings.

Business Summary: During this last year, Gina Curet has taken on the monumental task of VP of Business and everything Business in MARS Associates. This included updating the website for local and corporate business discounts. The most important role was re-establishing business contacts for the myriad medical benefits (Medical, Dental, Vision, and Hearing) available to a

member of MARS Associates. Rick Gonzales provided Gina with substantial support in updating these webpages. Gina also ensures that our non-profit status reporting is done on schedule with the state and federal agencies and negotiates the liability insurance our non-profit organization must carry. Gina learned a lot about the IRS and its workings this past year with above and beyond activities due to some missed reports the IRS finally found.

Membership Summary: In 2024, Carl Kaminski continued in his role as VP of Membership including the important tasks of maintaining the membership database, overseeing the renewal process, providing zip-sorted address labels for mailings, and providing name tags for all our events. As of January 1, 2025, we have 1,261 members with 595 of these being senior members. We are continuing to meet with HR counterparts at LM and ULA to ensure prospective retirees are provided with the latest information about MARS.

Secretary: Al Nemes continues in this role, capturing our minutes and decisions during our monthly meetings. Al also manages our data archive, making sure each of the Officers and Directors retains historical documents for the future. Next time you see Al, be sure to tell him he is doing a great job keeping us all honest and following our guiding documents.

President-Elect: Jim Pennington stepped up earlier in 2024 from his director role to be the new President-Elect. Jim will assume the Presidency January 1, 2026. Jim is quickly learning what is required and meeting people at our functions. If you have not met Jim yet, come to an event and meet him.

Marketing Committee: Dick Sosnay continued his Marketing leadership in 2024 and provided our membership with some memorable tours and experiences. Dick will be stepping back in 2025 and we hope to find a replacement for his leadership to continue these outings. An initial list of trips has been established for the person taking over. MARS Website: Our website at www.marsretirees.org is maintained by our Web Committee under the leadership of Steve Sande (Webmaster). The Web Committee coordinates changes/additions to the MARS website and ensures the underlying software products are up to date. The website contains very useful information about all facets of MARS. As we have transitioned to the digital MARS STAR, we are now providing a copy of the current and past MARS STARs on the website. Rick Gonzales continues to supplement Steve when he and Barb are out on one of their many yearly trips to faraway places.

Facebook: This year we continued with our MARS Facebook page, under the leadership of Steve Sande. The Facebook page membership has grown to 519 members at the start of 2025. <u>Annual Federal Tax and State Legal Filings</u>: As an Internal Revenue Code 501(c)(7) social club organization, MARS is exempt from Federal Income Tax. MARS has two (2) required filings.

- 1) The Federal Income Tax filing to change from a fiscal year to a calendar year was challenging. MARS hired H&R Block to file the appropriate forms per the deadline, and unfortunately, they did not meet the deadline. After months of IRS and H&R Block discussions, all issues were resolved. We will submit our 2024 tax filing by the deadline of May 15, 2025.
- 2) Colorado State law requires an annual Periodic Report filing to the Colorado Secretary of State to ensure the office address and registered agent information is accurate. The report was filed on March 5, 2024, which ensures MARS maintains a "Good Standing" status (statutory filing requirements have been met) with the Secretary of State.

<u>MARS Insurance Protections</u>: In 2024, we researched insurance brokers to provide MARS with the most cost effective and appropriate policies for our organization. We contracted our policies with Waterton Insurance Group through United States Liability Insurance (USLI) and reduced our overall costs.

Benefits Website: The benefits section of the website received a major update in October 2024. We added a pre-Medicare section for the 153 MARS members that are not yet 65 years old. Additionally, we included a Tax Adjustments drop-down and an Informational Sessions section for all materials presented. Organizing the topics enabled our members to find information at their fingertips.

<u>Benefit Plans</u>: MARS makes available to its members dental and vision plans, and hearing discounts. In October 2024, an audit was conducted to ensure compliance with our benefit providers that all participants were MARS members. We found over 100 participants that were not MARS members, requested back dues for up to eight years, and reinstated benefits to those individuals that paid the back dues. All participants in any MARS-provided benefit plan must be a MARS member.

In 2024, we made a conscious decision to move all benefit plans on a calendar year basis to mirror medical benefit plan renewal periods. We continue to provide great options and prices for our members.

- Delta Dental we negotiated an 8% rate reduction from 2023-2024 rates with a new 28-month rate guarantee effective September 1, 2024 through December 31, 2027.
- VSP we negotiated a 10% rate reduction in September 2024 that will remain in effect until December 31, 2025.

• Finally, we communicated a new vision plan in September 2024, DeltaVision, for member consideration in January 2025.

Representatives from Assured Partners, Delta Dental and DeltaVision attended the Annual Meeting and Picnic. This provided MARS members with the opportunity to ask questions about their current plans and review cost comparisons for alternative plans.

Informational Presentations: Kaiser Permanente presented two Understanding Medicare sessions, and the presentation materials were made available on the MARS website. Two classes are also planned for 2025: April 9th and September 16th.

Additional information sessions were presented by EverSource Wealth Advisors on "Engineer Your Legacy" and "Smart Strategies for Estate Planning" by Mercer Advisors. These well-attended sessions provided informative topics for our members.

LM Corporate and Local Colorado Discounts: Both discount sites were updated on the website, and we encourage members to utilize the cost-saving benefits.

VICE PRESIDENT, COMMUNICATIONS REPORT Dan Ellerhorst

2024 was the first full year that MARS Associates enjoyed an updated website, Facebook page, and associated digitally enhanced processes. These enhancements include the digital MARS STAR, online membership forms for joining MARS or renewing existing memberships, online payment capabilities, and bulk e-mail. The updated MARS website, www.marsretirees.org, has a more modern look and feel, is easier to navigate and maintain, and has improved security features. Our Webmaster, Steve Sande, has provided some interesting usage data later in this report.

Our Website Team meets periodically to review issues related to our commercial tool suite, to plan updates and enhancements to the website pages, and discuss further improvements to the reliability and security of our communications. This year, Steve Sande and Rick Gonzales have provided the bulk of the support for our toolset maintenance and the more complicated updates to the website. Other members of the team have provided updates to specific club pages on a recurring basis. We also welcomed several new members to the team including Gary Hetzel, Cindy Molnar, and Angie Mathias. Our goal is to spread the workload and provide backup for critical skills across the volunteer team.

In one important area, we moved to a new commercial software tool. We were disappointed with the reliability and performance of the free embedded e-mail capability that came with DreamHost (our basic website software). After a bit of a trade study, we settled on Zoho Campaigns as a very cost-effective, well-reviewed product that met all our requirements. We did some beta testing and discovered that it was not hard to use and provided a panoply of useful "analytics" – information about how many mails were delivered in a bulk transmission, which addresses bounced and why, how many of the mails were opened or clicked on. In 2024, we sent out over fifty messages to our members. In this way we can alert members to upcoming events, the availability of the digital STAR, and other important communications from the leadership.

Tom Pighetti and Linda Stearns continued to serve as our two MARS STAR editors and again did a fabulous job putting together all the news articles and pictures submitted by the contributors. This is no small effort, and we owe both Tom and Linda a boatload of thanks and appreciation.

Mike Carroll coordinates the printing and distribution of the MARS STAR, and the VP of Membership provides the labels for the bulk mailing. In 2024, Carl Kaminski did this service – it will transition to Jayne Brown in 2025. Producing and distributing the STAR has gotten easier as we moved to the digital STAR but still require significant effort. We continue to mail out about 225 printed copies of the STAR to members who have requested this as a preference. Lockheed Martin has graciously agreed to continue to fund the production and mailing of the STAR. We appreciate and acknowledge the efforts of all these people to produce this very important and popular quarterly newsletter.

VICE PRESIDENT, MEMBERSHIP REPORT Jayne Brown

Renewal: We are continuing with the option to renew membership or enroll as new member online. During 2024, 59% of the renewals were executed online. This is a significant increase from 46% in 2023. The ability to renew or enroll for new members via a paper copy has been retained. Click on the Membership tab on the MARS website for additional information.

Current Membership: Membership statistics below are as of January 1, 2025. Current members have until March 31, 2025, to renew their membership for FY2025-2026 and remain active members. The Senior Members count includes 30 members who became 75 years of age between March 1, 2024, and February 28, 2025, which qualifies them as Senior Members. This number also includes surviving spouses of members who would be 75 as of February 28, 2025, as they retain that status.

In 2024, we continue to offer free membership to new members for their first year. Last year, 67% of those who received free membership in 2023 renewed their membership for 2024.

Members who have become inactive (dropped from membership) whether because they did not pay dues in the previous year or they moved without providing a new address (hence their mailings were returned as undeliverable two or more times in a calendar year) may reinstate their membership by printing and mailing the membership application posted on the website, indicating they wish to be reinstated, and including the applicable dues.

Communications: Our records indicate that about 99% (1,246) of our members have an email address. Of those members with an email address, 89% (1,115) have agreed to receive mass emails from MARS. Our shift to the electronic publication of the MARS STAR has contributed to electronic distribution to 1,034 members (82%) of the membership. We continue to offer hard copies of the STAR to those members that request it.

TREASURERS REPORT Charles Haupt

The yearly audit of the Club's books was conducted, as required by the Bylaws, by Don Johnson and Patrick Shannon on February 14, 2024, covering the MARS fiscal year beginning 1 January 2023 and ending 31 December 2023. The audit team met with the MARS Associates Treasurer and reviewed the records of all revenue and expense transactions against the debit and credit entries to the MARS account spreadsheet for each month of the fiscal year. The audit resulted in no findings or deficiencies and showed the MARS financial process and controls to be free of any material errors, omissions, or inaccuracies.

The beginning FY2024 checkbook balance was \$16,278.08. The end-of-the-year checkbook balance was \$19,546.82. Income from membership dues and events totaled \$56,989.83. The total disbursements for refunds, event expenses, and overhead operational expenses was \$53,721.09. This leads to an overall increase to the bank account of \$3,268.74 for the year 2024. The books were balanced on December 31, 2024.

Your MARS Associates organization goes through a budget determination and approval process every operating year. The actuals for FY2024 and the budget for FY2025 are shown below. The projected end-of-year balance for 2025 is \$12,442. It should be noted that the Officers and Board of Directors have decided that the bank account needs to be reduced; therefore, a decision has been made to subsidize our main events at a higher rate for the benefit of membership.

The audit of FY2024 will be conducted in the Spring of 2025.

No club officers are necessary. Sue Janssen was the club Point of Contact (POC) for 2024 and reports to MARS officers, as necessary. Beth King will be the 2025 POC for the club. No budget is necessary as members cover their own expenses and provide their own equipment. Planning is accomplished

We also conducted several information sessions providing health information to our target group.

We meet at 11:00 am and we have a dedicated meeting room where we order "working lunch" prior to the meeting start, and the event speaker kicks off the session. Each meeting is usually over by 1:00pm to allow everyone to go do their other things for the day. We had a great overall attendance and very educational information sessions where the attendees engaged both our lead topic speakers and the others in attendance. Each session had a discussion first and we always had a Q&A session at the end to allow attendees an opportunity to ask questions. The camaraderie and interaction exceeded expectations. Just ask any of our meeting attendees.

Here are the sessions that we conducted in 2024:

• July 10, 2024 – Meeting Topic: Cardiac and Oncology Health. Speaker: Dr. Mark Sheehan. Dr. Sheehan is known as "The Mr. Cardiac Doctor of Denver." He is now retired and very involved in voluntary work in third world countries. He recently returned from a missionary trip to Cambodia with some other local docs to doctor those people.

- September 18, 2024 Meeting Topic: Apollo 12 Landing and use of a new landing navigation method. Speaker: Matt Grogan, who was a former NASA Manned Spacecraft Center employee supporting Apollo 8 to 15 missions and later joined Martin Marietta to participate in the Viking and other NASA/Military Programs.
- October 9, 2024 Meeting Topic: Civil Space Mission Operations. Speaker: Beth Buck from LM Space Civil Space discussing various Space Probe and other programs like OSIRIS-REx Mission. She also talked about the complexities of landing a probe on an asteroid to get a sample to bring back for analysis.
- November 13, 2024 Meeting Topic: Blue Zones. Speaker: Gene Dionne presented his research and study on the "Blue Zones." Blue Zones are regions in the world where people are claimed to have exceptionally long lives beyond the age of 80 due to a lifestyle combining physical activity, low stress, rich social interactions, a local whole-foods diet, and low disease incidence.

At the time of this report, Pacesetters had also conducted its first meeting of 2025, which was:

• January 15, 2025 – Meeting Topic: Alzheimer's Status Lecture. Speaker: Representative from the Colorado Alzheimer's Association. The presentation will discuss the definition and scientific profile of Alzheimer's disease risk factors, prevention techniques that are empirically validated.

The following is a brief description of each activity for 2024:

Wine Tasting

This function was coordinated by Terry Lilly and Robin Zen. We had a great group of 41 members and guests of MARS Associates participate in the wine tasting on Tuesday, April 23. We sampled six different wines from the previous tasting. Following the tasting, attendees received a full glass of any wine on the menu.

Water2Wine, located in the Oakbrook Shopping Center (on County Line Road, near Broadway), offers over forty different wines for tasting. This is a fully operating winery where all their wines are blended, oaked and fermented onsite. They start with grapes sourced from vineyards around the world. Melissa, the owner, explained each of the six wines before we tasted them.

Terry and Robin provided a nice assortment of fruit, cheese, crackers, and chocolates that worked well with wine.

Colorado Railroad Museum Tour

On Tuesday, April 30th, a group of 19 MARS members and guests enjoyed a tour of the Colorado Railroad Museum in Golden, led by Robin Zen. We viewed and stepped aboard a variety of locomotives, passenger, and freight cars, dating from the 1880s to the 1980s. These included the Galloping Goose, a rotary ice breaker, and a turntable. Several of the guys participated in moving the railway turntable used for moving locomotives or cars so they face a different direction or change tracks. A handful of us enjoyed an extra tour of the inner workings of the large indoor HO/HOn3 scale model train display, with a full circus, a large city, mountains, trestles, tunnels, rivers, mining camps and more, all replicating the various types of Colorado mountain railroading.

Following the museum tour, we headed to the Yard House for happy hour food and drinks, and great conversation.

The Wild Animal Sanctuary

Our next event was a return trip to the Wild Animal Sanctuary in Keenesburg on Tuesday, May 14, led by long-time sanctuary supporter Carolyn Malaby. Our group of 27 MARS attendees met at the Welcome Center at 9:00 a.m., and after the introduction, we were free to explore this amazing place at our own pace. The weather was nice and cool, with a cool breeze. We enjoyed a tour of the world's largest carnivore sanctuary, home to over 550 lions, tigers, bears, wolves, leopards, and other animals. From the Walk into the Wild walkway ABOVE the animals, where they don't feel threatened and don't pace like they do in zoos, we saw arctic foxes, red foxes, lots of bears, lions, tigers, wolves, lynxes, a jaguar, a few camels off in the distance and had a great time. The world's largest carnivore sanctuary (including its Texas facility, The Wild Animal Refuge near Springfield, CO and the new Wild Horse Refuge near Craig, CO) is home to over 550 bears, wolves, wild horses, and large cats. Begun in 1980 by Pat Craig, it is an amazing place to see these and other animals including camels, mountain lions and foxes. Everyone enjoyed the time and were glad to support the sanctuary with the entrance fee.

ULA Tour

The function was coordinated by Terry Lilly. On Tuesday, May 21, there was an impressive ULA tour given to 21 MARS retirees and guests. ULA had a presentation followed by a tour of the DOSC, SIL, and the Mission Success wall. The enthusiastic tour leads did a nice job educating the

group with ULA updates. Attendees received parting gifts and to top the afternoon off was a drawing for a couple to return to view a launch in the DOSC. Oh my, what a treat!

Following the ULA Tour was a Happy Hour at Max Taps. Seven energetic MARS retirees and guests continued the afternoon, following the ULA tour, enjoying further discussion on LM and ULA activities from the past.

State Capitol/History Museum

The History Colorado Museum has many permanent exhibits about the Sand Creek Massacre, 10th Mountain Division, history of the Ute tribe, as well as a new exhibit featuring the photography of John Fielder.

Central City Opera

On Wednesday, July 24, we enjoyed a return to the Central City Opera, led by Sue Janssen. This year, a total of 29 MARS members and guests thoroughly enjoyed The Pirates of Penzance, a comedic operetta with swashbuckling adventures and harmonious hijinks. It was a wonderful experience to drive up through our foothills in the middle of summer to visit this old mining town with its historic opera house, grab lunch, see a wonderful operetta and enjoy the ambience of Central City.

LM Waterton Plant Tour

Lockheed Martin Space hosted 25 of our MARS members for a tour of the Waterton Campus on Thursday, August 28, 2024. The tour guide was Brian Ysasaga, Systems Engineer, National Security Space, who is a member of Joe Rice's organization. The tour included first a visit to the Pulsar Lab in the Engineering building, which showed what LM Space does, and some of the missions in work. This was followed by a tour of the Collaborative Human Immersive Lab (CHIL) area also in the Engineering building. Then the group were transported to the Mission Support Area in the FAB (Factory Assembly Bldg.), which included the Orion Lab Area. The tour began at 10:30 a.m. and ended at 1:30 p.m. Our sincere thanks and appreciation to Joe Rice and Brian for providing this opportunity for our retirees once again. Many of the retirees had not been at any of the facilities in 20 years or more, so this was a welcome event.

Did you know that there has never been a robbery inside the Denver Mint (except for a delivery truck outside the Mint)? There was one case of an employee (Orville Harrington) stealing gold bars because he was disgruntled from not getting a raise in 14 years. In case you are interested in coins for purchase, you can visit the gift shop without going on a tour.

Following the Mint tour, half of the group headed to the Pint Pub for some authentic British pub food (bangers and mash, fish and chips), pints and other drinks. Thank you to all the attendees for making this a fun and educational event!

State Capitol/History Museum Tour #2

Our afternoon was complete with free time to explore the museum. History Colorado has very interesting displays of the 10th Mountain Division and their role in Colorado history, The Sand Creek Massacre as well as Zoom In-100 objects from Colorado that bring back more than one or two memories.

Glenwood Springs Train Tour




